Methodology



On behalf of the Center for American Progress Action Fund and Public Citizen, Change Research conducted a poll of 1,200 registered voters nationally from June 7-12, 2021. The modeled margin of error for this survey is 3.7%, which uses effective sample sizes that adjust for the design effect of weighting.

Change Research reaches voters via targeted online ads that point people to an online survey instrument. Our Dynamic Online Sampling establishes and continuously rebalances advertising targets across region, age, gender, race, and partisanship to dynamically deliver large samples that accurately reflect the demographics of a population. Post stratification was done on region, gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, and vote choice history.

- Technology companies are mostly good for America, and provide good jobs and important products and services that consumers need.



Big technology companies and social media companies have:


- O Too much power and influence over politics and government....

Opinions of social media & tech companies




How favorable are your feelings about each of the following people, companies, organizations and groups?



Opinions of tech companies by party






Arguments for greater regulation of technology



Some federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies in the United States use facial recognition technology to analyze public security camera



Support for pausing facial recognition technology



In the last year, faulty facial recognition technology led to the false arrest of several innocent Americans and has been found to be inaccurate in 98% of cases.
